PHYSICIAN RECOMMENDATIONS:

Recommendation 1:	Would pursue genetic referral with microarray and fragile x, refer back to ophthalmology .
Recommendation 2:	educate regarding risk of wandering and the need for water safety/swim lessons. Explore self
	care and respite and refer to AutismSpeaks first 100 days tool kit.

PEDIATRIC NEUROPSYCHOLOGIST RECOMMENDATIONS:

Recommendation 1:	Consider accessing resources through the Idaho Education Services for the Deaf and the Blind
Recommendation 2:	Continue with plans to have him evaluated by Ascend as they can potentially gather
	additional information regarding his developmental functioning and assist with treatment
	planning.

PEDIATRIC SLP RECOMMENDATIONS:

Recommendation 1:	Private speech and language services focusing on reciprocal play and prelinguistic/ linguistic goals
Recommendation 2:	Feeding therapy evaluation

COUNSELOR RECOMMENDATIONS:

Recommendation 1:	Following parental functioning would recommend all supports to be in home or with parents
	rather than parents being self directed. I would include or encourage all caregivers to be
	involved with ongoing treatments when ever possible in order to support consistency with
	treatments and knowledge. Potential request for the treatment team to meet for Care Team
	meeting making sure everyone is aware of barriers, strengths, recommendations and future
	treatment needs.

- Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) (The goal of behavior therapy is to increase behaviors that are helpful and decrease behaviors that are harmful or affect learning. Family may benefit from the implementation of techniques for understanding and changing behavior based on the principles of applied behavior analysis).
