Effective Labor Plan – Setting expectations

Hospital screening for admission (e.g. COVID-19 screen)

Nutrition, eating, iv fluids

Who will be present (family, Doula, support)

Labor augmentation and reasons for intervention

- FHR monitoring
- •AROM
- Oxytocin

Cesarean section

Labor Analgesia

Cord clamping, deliver to chest

Vitamin K, antibiotic ointment, HBV

Hearing screen/CHD/bili check/newborn screen

Breastfeeding

Circumcision (timing and cost)



- Breastfeeding/Lactation


Newborn vaccine schedule

- Options of treatment, intervention





Key Points

- Consider the continuum of care in maternal care, it's a package
 - Prenatal, delivery, postnatal, newborn
- Outline prenatal expectations in first visit(s)
- Answer questions as they arise, open communication
 - Trust, respect, understanding
- Discuss newborn screenings and childhood vaccines early
- The relationship you develop during pregnancy is invaluable



Case 1

- 36yoF G9P7
- Chronic hypertension
- History of preeclampsia in 3 of previous 7 pregnancies
- Had risk-reducing bilateral mastectomy since last pregnancy
- Regularly brings other children to appointments
- Husband is arrested midway through pregnancy
- Having a male child



Expectations, Case 1

- Mental health
- Cell-free DNA
- Controlling BP, monitor for preeclampsia, aspirin
- RSV, Tdap, influenza
- Birth control, permanent sterilization?
- Labor support, who will be present for birth
- Unable to breastfeed
- Circumcision
- Other?



Case 2

- 23yoF G1P0
- Presented to care when arrested for drug possession, estimated 34w
- Hospitalized for amphetamine and opiate withdrawal, discharged home on buprenorphine-naloxone
- Coming into clinic for abdominal pain after moving home with her parents yesterday

- Birth control
- Other?



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
